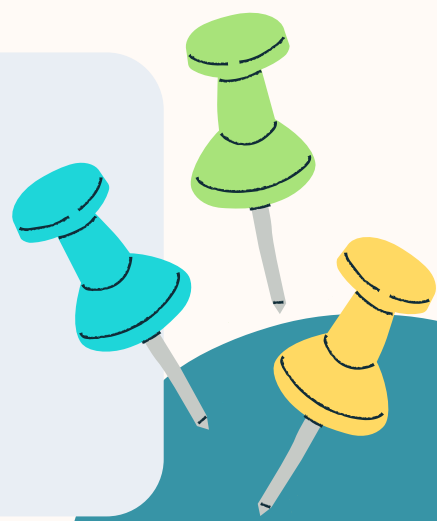
Social and emotional skills

- Interacts well with other children
- Listens to and follows adult directions
- Is excited and ready to learn
- Demonstrates independence in personal care (washing hands, bathroom use)

Motor skills

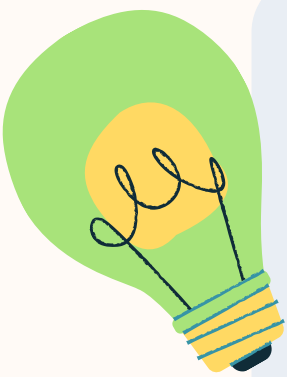
- Uses a pencil or crayon with some control, cuts with scissors
- Copies basic shapes, like a straight line, circle, x, and +
- Runs, jumps, hops, and climbs
- Can put together a 4+ piece puzzle

Reading readiness skills

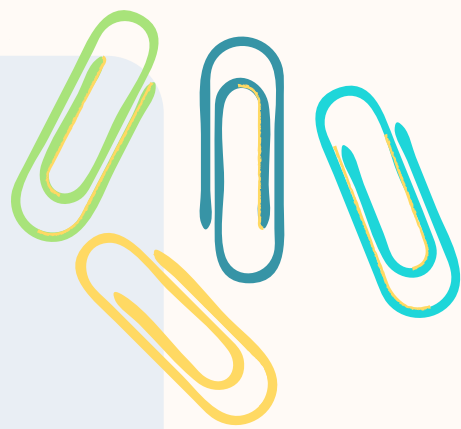
- Recognizes and tries to write their name
- Has basic book handling skills and enjoys listening to stories
- Recognizes rhyming words
- Makes simple predictions and comments about a story being read

Basic math skills

- Organizes objects that go together in groups (color, category, size, etc.)
- Counts 10 or more items
- Recognizes, copies, or repeats patterning sequence
- Understands *more than* and *less than*
